| Page 20 | <p>STUDENT CONDUCT</p> <p>The conduct of college students, both in and out of school, is expected to be that of any respectable adult in a public place. Students should consider at all times that the reputation of the institution depends in no small part upon their behavior. No long list of rules and penalties should be necessary if each student abides by the rules of common courtesy and cooperation; however, certain North Carolina state laws govern the use and possession of firecrackers, firearms, or explosives of any kind. Surry Community College has adopted and implemented a program to prevent the illicit use of drugs and the abuse of alcohol by students and employees.</p> <p>State laws also prohibit hazing of any student by another student or students. The college will dismiss any students who in its judgment conduct themselves in a manner incompatible with the purposes of the college. Students must possess the behavioral and social attributes that allow them to interact civilly with others, as well as the ability to not represent a threat to self or others. <i>(Adopted by the President's Cabinet, September 14, 2009.)</i></p> |

Technology fees are based on the hours of the course as stipulated above.</i></p> <p><i>A student who wishes to withdraw from a Continuing Education course must contact the Continuing Education office prior to the 10% point of the scheduled hours of the class to be eligible for a tuition refund. A 75% refund will be given if the student request is received by the deadline. If a student pre-registers/prepays for a class and requests a refund prior to the first class meeting, 100% of the tuition will be returned.</i></p> <p><i>Tuition fees are set by the North Carolina General Assembly and may change. Any person repeating an Occupational course for the third time will be charged an additional fee.</i></p> <p><i>The technology fee is waived for Basic Skills students, HRD students, and students enrolled in emergency services training courses.</i></p> <p><i>All continuing education students who attend class during the day must purchase a parking permit.
